1232 1/2 hours out of town calls and spent 1232 in practice sessions, for a total contribution of 246 1/4 hours of volunteer service during the first seven months of the year.

Out of the City Fires
Thirty-five of the out of town calls were to grass, trash or rubbish fires all the way from Sheridan to Lisle and from Bonus to Ramsey, said the assistant chief Saturday night. Two of the alarms were to hay and equipment barns, one at Elm Grove and one at Rock Island; 3 to car and truck accidents for wash-

Hwy. 71 Columbus Bypass Is In 1977-78 Projects

During the regular term of Colorado County Commissioners' Court Monday, the county officials heard a report from the Texas Highway Department officials on the status of projects in this county during the forthcoming 1977 year and future years.

Deputy Highway Engineer Carl V. Ramert, Resident Engineer Clarence Weiss and Earl Wyatt, of the Right of Ways division, were on hand to present plans in "response to a changing environment."

Mr. Ramert outlined some of the factors which have affected the selection of highway projects in the future and the manner in which future projects will be selected. He noted that Interstate 10 and Highway 71 through this county are considered "backbone systems" and as such are given priority rating in upgrading programs.

3 County Officials Are Appointed
Included on the agenda of the Colorado County Commissioners' Court, in regular session Monday, was the appointment of three officers for the 1977 year.

The court reappointed Columbus attorney John Hancher as the County Veterans Service Officer and Louis Richard of Waco as Assistant County Service Officer. Also, Mrs. Bernice Richter of Weimar, Registered Nurse, was appointed as the County Health Nurse for the 1977 year. Comments were made on the good work performed by Mrs. Richter since her appointment during this year. County Health Officer, Dr. Raymond Thomas of Eagle Lake, especially praised her work, stated County Judge Lester J. Crane.

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Truck Driver Pinned Under Bed, Dies
A truck driver was crushed to death when the dump truck bed on which he was working in a partial lift position fell, crushing him to the frame of the truck.

The county sheriff's office reported that the driver, who was pinned under the bed, died of injuries sustained when the bed fell on him. The driver was working on the truck's brake line when the accident occurred. The driver was a resident of Eagle Lake.

Helpful Motorist Steals Belongings Of Hitchhikers
Two hitch-hikers on Interstate 10 were victims of a robbery at 7:30 p.m. last Sunday, Dec. 12th reported the county sheriff's office. The two, listed on the report as John and Bridget, age unknown, from California, reported that they had obtained a ride with a white male in a brown Mercury just east of San Antonio and when they stopped at a rest area just west of Columbus to go to the restrooms, the driver of the car drove off with all of their belongings. They told the officers they lost some clothing and a purse with \$1.50 inside but carried no identification compromising them. They had been robbed in New Mexico five days prior to this incident.

Alice Fogg Dies Suddenly In Houston
Friends in the community were shocked Tuesday night to learn of the sudden death of Mrs. Alice Fogg, 53, of Eagle Lake, who died in Houston.

She had undergone surgery for a broken hip received in a recent fall and was apparently recovering nicely when she died quite suddenly shortly before 10 p.m. She is the sister of the Rev. George Welch, rector of Christ Episcopal Church here, and she was formerly employed at Thomas Clinic.
