LCRA Soil Testing Lab Doubles Tests

Soil testing in the Lower Colorado River Authority Laboratory at Wharton County Junior College in Wharton almost doubled during the past fiscal year according to Melvin Wingfield, director.

There were 2,426 samples processed during the fiscal year ending in August compared to 1,419 for the previous period.

Changes in crop production including increased corn planting and introduction of grain sorghums on some cotton fields has been attributed as one cause of the increased interest in soil testing.

The WCJCL lab also recommends sampling at least every other year although many farmers wait until the third year. The long period of dry weather before planting last season gave producers more time for testing.

The charge for a soil test is \$2.00. An additional \$3.00 is charged to determine zinc and iron deficiency. An atomic absorption spectrophotometry unit checks for the micro-nutrients. Tests are also made for crude protein in hay at the laboratory located on the Wharton campus of Wharton County Junior College. Soil sample boxes and information sheets are available at the

college or from county agents' offices.

The following instructions are listed for maximum results from soil testing:

- Have soil tested about thirty days before you expect to fertilize.
- Use a clean sack, box or bucket to mix sample in field.
- Take soil from upper six inches of surface soil.
- Take soil from 10 to 20 places in the field, mix well and take out your sample.
- Send only one pint of soil for each sample with complete information outlining soil condition and crop history. Information sheets are available at WCJCL.
- Be sure sample number on information sheet corresponds with number on sample container.
- Package sample lightly and mail parcel post.
- Address sample to Wharton County Junior College, Lower Colorado River Authority Soil Testing Laboratory, 1917 Alabama Road, Wharton, Texas 77488.
- Make checks payable to Wharton County Junior College Soil Testing Laboratory.

HOLIDAY TRAFFIC SAFETY TIPS

The 55 mph speed limit may have decreased deaths due to auto accidents but fatality rates are climbing again. Many factors are involved but carelessness, especially on country roads,

unsafe cars, bad weather and motorists who don't wear seat belts all contribute to accidents that could be prevented, the Texas Medical Association (TMA) says.

In 1975 there were 4.1 people killed for every 100 million miles traveled compared to 3.9 in 1974. The trend seems to be increasing, the Governor's Office for Traffic Safety says.

A National Safety Council study shows country roads produce nine times as many deaths and 14 times as many property damage accidents as do controlled-access, express highways. Blind intersections and reduced vision on curves and hills contribute to many crashes. Being alert and prepared to stop in these situations can save many lives.

Even AM or FM radio weather forecasts can give valuable information about what's coming. Sometimes postponing a trip for a few hours or a day will avoid bad weather that can threaten even experienced drivers. Arriving late is better than not arriving at all, FEMA says.

People increase their chances of arriving alive if they wear seat belts. Even if people refuse to use belts on short errands, buckling up on a trip is not too much trouble. Hospital beds or caskets are much more confining than seat belts.
