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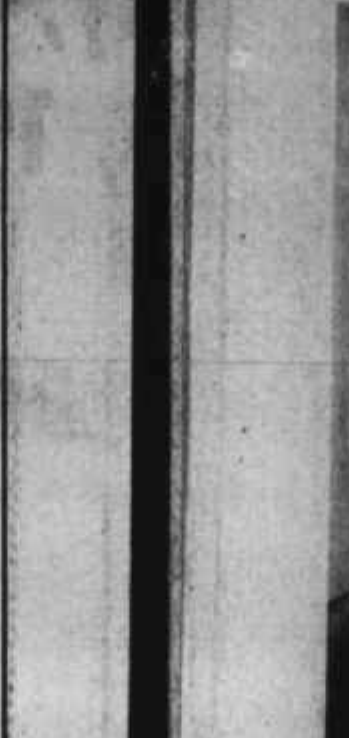

Over 50 Dogs Picked Up Under New Ordinance

The City of Eagle Lake reports that over fifty dogs have been captured and placed in the city pound since the passing of the new dog control ordinance for this city.

City Manager T. J. Smith said that courtesy warnings have been issued to several pet owners whose pets are in direct violation of the ordinance and are not under the owner's control as required in the ordinance. He noted, however, that if some effort is not made by these persons to comply with the requirements, tickets will be issued and pet owners will be subject to a fine of \$10.00 on the first offense and \$20.00 for each succeeding offense up to a maximum of \$100.00.

**Roaming Dogs Illegal**  
Under the ordinance, dogs running at large on the streets or on property other than that of the dog's owner, will be subject to being picked up and placed in the city pound.
