Soil Dist. Has Record For Continuing Excellence

Recognition for excellence is becoming an annual habit for the Colorado Soil Conservation District.

After being named a winner in the nationwide Good Year Conservation Awards two years ago, they were chosen as an honor district for Region III.

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The Colorado SWCD was organized by a vote of the landowners in 1947. Since that time, more than 797 landowners and operators have become cooperators with the District. Plans have been developed and conservation practices have been applied on more than 208,856 acres of agricultural land in Colorado County.

The 5-member board of directors supervises the operations of the District and is concerned with all aspects of the community environment in addition to the planning and application of conservation practices on the
