Resolution Passed

The resolution sets out these facts:

"First, the Statement of Intent of Central Power and Light Company to Change Electric Rates subject to the jurisdiction of this municipality is denied and the new rates proposed by Central Power and Light Company shall not be placed in operation because of the Company's refusal to comply with Section 23 of Article 1446c and because its proposed rates are unreasonable. The Company shall not charge rates in excess of rates in effect prior to the filing of said Statement of Intent to Change Rates.

"Second, the Company is required to reimburse this municipality for its reasonable costs for rate consultants, attorneys, engineers and auditors representing this City in this rate matter, including work and representation in Docket 91 before the Public Utility Commission of Texas. The Company shall be billed for such costs and the City shall take such action as may be necessary to obtain such reimbursement, including
