

VA EXPENDITURES IN TEXAS PASS \$1.2 BILLION MARK

The Veterans Administration spent \$1,202,897,759 in Texas during fiscal year 1976, according to recent figures released by the VA. This represents an increase of \$156.6 million over fiscal year 1975 expenditures in Texas by VA.

Ted W. Myatt, Director of the VA Regional Office in Houston, said these figures represent \$30.12 billion in compensation and pension benefits to veterans. \$345,818,584 is GI Bill educational benefits and \$45,265,910 in insurance and indemnities. The remainder was spent for construction and operating costs.
