Warns of High Fin. Charges

"Finance companies are trying to pass a bill that will legalize loan sharking in Texas and clog the courts," said Senator Bill Patman of Ganado this week. "Loan company lobbyists have publicly called for raises in present interest rate limits to enable them to charge Texas borrowers as much as 25% more than the extra-high rates they are already gouging them with. The charges on a 37-month loan of \$1,000 would increase from \$339.17 to \$425.50 under the

loan company proposal.
"Only \$165.87 can be charged for the same loan under the constitutional 10% limit, but in 1967 the Legislature authorized the \$339.17 finance companies now charge. Under the 1960 amendment to the Texas constitution, the limit of 10% only applies where the Legislature does not legalise higher rates. The Legislature is now unlimited by the constitution as to the interest rates it may authorize.
