That is how the modern world discovered that the steps of the Parthenon on the Acropolis in Athens were convex. Why did the ancient Greek architects curve the steps in convex fashion? At first it was believed that they made the marble steps rise in the center and descend at either end because most people would use the center portion of the steps to enter the temple. Hence, they would be worn down in the center first.

But modern architects and engineers soon discarded this theory. They realized that the steps were so designed to deceive the human eye. For human vision has many faults and one is that a series of perfectly straight lines look curved. Therefore, the ancient Athenians constructed the steps to match the failings of the human eye.

Further investigation revealed that the columns of the Parthenon incline inward. And the spacing of the columns is irregular at the center only. Again, for the same reason: to compensate for the failings of the human eye.

Only one question remains: How did the ancient Greeks, who started the Parthenon in 447 B.C., know how to create this absolute symmetry? What engineering and mathematical formulas were used to compensate for man's imperfect sight? The principle of optical illusion, of making horizontal lines look straight by slanting or curving them, required the highest degree of technical knowledge. With what wit did the ancient Greeks accomplish these things? Modern man still doesn't know.
