V.F.W. Auxiliary Notes Changes In Flag Code

Since February is considered the month of "hearts" when we love with Valentine's boxes of heart-shaped candy, and various other gifts, let us also remember in our hearts of hearts to fly our flags on these two suggested patriotic holidays:

Feb. 12: Birthday of Abraham Lincoln (1809).

Feb. 21: Traditional 22nd or third Monday: Birthday of George Washington (1732).

The Federal Flag Code (For Civilians and Civilian Organizations) recommends proper display of and respect for the U.S. flag. By a joint resolution of the U.S. Congress, the Code was amended on July 7, 1976 by 94th Congress, S.J. Res. 49, Public Law 94-344, Title 4, U.S. Code Chapter 1 Sections 1 and 2 and Executive Order 10834 per President Gerald R. Ford.

The following are some of the changes:

The flag may be displayed 24 hours a day if properly illuminated during the hours of darkness.

The flag should not be displayed in inclement weather except when an all-weather flag is displayed.

The flag should be displayed on all days, and especially on designated holidays, birthdays of the States (date of admission to the Union), and Nationalities.

The flag should not be dipped to any person or thing. State flags and organizational flags are to be dipped as a mark of honor to the U.S. flag.

The flag should never be used for advertising purposes in any manner whatsoever.

No part of the flag should be used as a receptacle for anything, however, a flag patch may be affixed to the uniform of military personnel.

The listed are the only legitimate occasions the U.S. flag can be flown "half staff".

Monday, Day until noon.

By order of the President on the deaths of the following:

Principal figures of the U.S. Government, 2. Governor of a State, territory, or possession, 3. Other officials or foreign dignitaries (Presidential order or recognized custom), 4. Current or former President, 30 days after the death of a State, territory, or possession, 5. Secretary of Defense or military department, 6. A member of Congress on day of death and the following day.

This code does not impose penalties for misuse of the U.S. flag. Each state has its own flag law, and the Federal Government for the District of Columbia.
