County Health Nurse at Mission Center Fridays

Between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. or can be reached at phone 234-3022. Between the hours of 9:00 and 12 noon every Friday, the center will have diabetic screening, and hypertension screening, available to all citizens of the community. Anyone over forty years of age should be screened, said the health nurse. For those under 40, the high risk group, includes close blood relatives with diabetes, overweight, and parents of a large baby over nine pounds, noted the nurse.
