

## It's Official Popp Gets \$1000 Go Texan Scholarship

The Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo presented Gerald Wayne Popp with a \$1,000 Area Go Texan Scholarship during Colorado County Night festivities at the Astrodome. The show awards a \$1,000 college scholarship to a recipient from each of the 31 counties participating in Go Texan activities. These awards are part of an overall \$10,000 college scholarship more than \$500,000 to a scholarship program benefiting some 140 students attending Texas colleges and universities this fall.

The Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo also presents 15 4-H and FFA scholarships ranging from \$400 to \$4,000, four college awards. Additionally, the show also provides four one-year \$1,000 scholarships to Prairie View A&M University students and six assistantships to graduate students at various state universities.
