Glen has been showing for one year. The breeder of "Midnight" is J. R. and R. A. Lanning, Eden, Tex. Glen is in the fifth grade at Garwood Elementary and plays basketball in his Little League baseball team. Calf Scramble Winner Woody Jones Back In Spotlight

It came as quite a surprise to the rodeo audience when a 53, 120-pound boy captured a calf in the 1976 Houston Livestock Show Calf Scramble Contest.

Woody Jones, 16, said it even came as a surprise to him. But he did win and he returned to the Houston Show this year to show his Jersey heifer in the Scramble Show.

Woody is from Garwood.

Each winner in the scramble contest agrees to keep monetary records and monthly progress reports of his calf's progress. Winners learn how to groom and train their animals, as well as learning the distinct characteristics of different breeds of cattle. These reports are supplemented with pictures and a 200 word essay. When all of these requirements are fulfilled, the calf belongs wholly to the student.

Woody says he has found through this year that dairy calves are not as much trouble as market calves and their feed costs are not near as high. Also, they are easier to keep clean and a lot tamer, he said. "They're just like a pet."

The Houston Livestock Show Calf Scramble provides youth with a unique opportunity to learn about livestock and to exhibit them in competition. The program is supervised by a vocational or agriculture teacher who supervises the student's formal records.

Besides being a learning experience, the show often provides the winners an excellent heifer calf with which to start a future herd.
