So you want to change your locks? You don't actually have to replace them. Simply take the old locks to a locksmith for \$20.00, or replace the lockers with new ones.

No key lock is actually pick-proof, but there are a number of pick-resistant cylinders available. The cost \$10 or \$20 more than ordinary cylinders but will stop a burglar, or make him take longer outside your door than he'd like to.

Few burglars will actually pick locks. According to a detective on the New York City Police Department, "The pick man is highly skilled and experienced, and for that skill, unless you've got a lot of money, he probably won't bother you."

Combination locks are pick-proof, but they are just as likely to slow you down, because you have to remember to use them. For real security, make sure your door is strong too.

You may want to replace your lock for another reason. If you are moving, you should have your old lock removed to prevent someone from using it. Just in case those strong doors and secure locks are not protection enough, let your insurance company know you need. Look into the homeowner's package at
