that portion of the municipal building used for the postoffice to the Postal Service. The contract for the postoffice facilities will expire next year and will need to be renewed. It is anticipated that the annual rental fee of \$3500 per year, will be increased in any new lease contract given to the Postal Service.

Library Bd. Asks Aid

The Rev. George Welch, a member of the board of the Eagle and David Wintermann Library, appeared before the council to make a request for continued financial assistance from the city. Mayor Elmer Welch told the Rev. Mr. Welch that the budget, coming before the council soon, has provisions for continued financial assistance in the amount of \$1200.00 per year, and it is anticipated that at least that amount will be approved for library assistance.

The council approved bills from the engineering firm of O'Neale and Clay in the amount of \$622.14 for assistance in preparation of the application for federal assistance for the drainage program (which since has been turned down) and for \$2000.14 for work done in determining the boundaries and location of the ditch which crosses under East Main Street and goes south toward the Eagle Lake Primary School and then west along K Street.

SMOKE TESTING IN SEWER INFILTRATION STUDY CONTINUES

Over Half of City Now Tested; Working Downtown

Work continues in the downtown areas north of the Southern Pacific Railroad track as the survey being made here to locate points of infiltration of ground water and inflow into the city's sanitation sewerage system.

If you see men crawling in and out of manholes or see smoke billowing from the ground or from vent stacks of your home or office, don't be alarmed.

The Environmental Engineering Firm of Gutierrez, Smouse, Wilmet and Associates of Dallas is working here in association with the Bernard Johnson Engineers of Houston. The work will last about two more months and is being done in conjunction with the city's application for federal assistance in improving the city's sewer plant facilities.

Workers enter the manholes between 12:30 midnight and 5 a.m. to locate points of infiltration into the city's sewer system.

Using Smoke Bombs

City Manager T. J. Smith notes that smoke bombs are being used to find points of infiltration as the smoke is forced through the pipes and exits at points of leakage. Inflow of rain water into the system is also being noted in the survey. Some smoke may be seen exiting from vent stacks or holes in the ground or from leaks in private buildings or on private properties, but there is no cause for alarm.

Smith said the smoke should not enter homes unless the home has faulty plumbing, but added that the smoke is non-toxic, harmless, has no odor and creates no fire hazard.
