EXTENDED COVERAGE

With just a little extra care, you can protect your car against theft. Rule number one, of course, is always remove the ignition key. Rule two, don't hide another key in the car.

In an attended parking lot, leave the ignition key ONLY. It should not be a tag with your name and address. The car should be in the center where it would be noticed.

When you park, be sure to lock doors and close windows. In hot weather, open windows a quarter-inch for ventilation. Be sure all valuables are locked in the trunk.

If the car stalls on the highway, stay with it and wait for the police. (Never leave it unlocked. Thief may be a good mechanic, too, and drive away.)

Your car should be locked even when it's parked in your own garage or driveway. That's where most cars are stolen.
