The Raiders had an open date on Tuesday of this week, but return to action Friday when they travel to Sweeney to take on the Bulldogs in a game at 7:30 p.m. After the Wharton game next Tuesday at 4:00 p.m., the Raiders could be out their regular schedule by hosting the Edna Cowboys in a game at 4 p.m. Friday, May 6th.

Against Columbia last Friday, the Raiders won a 7 to 5 decision, putting together ten stolen bases, six hits and good pitching by Jeff Wied to record their fourth district win compared to one loss.

Deer Season Set Nov. 12-Jan. 1

A second year of limited mule deer hunting in the Trans-Pecos and an increase in the number of striped bass which may be caught were among fish and game regulations recently approved by Texas Parks and Wildlife Commissioners.

Parks and Wildlife Commissioners also gave the department's law enforcement division authority to file on Texas landowners who deliberately falsify ownership of land or number of acres owned or leased when applying for mule deer hunting permits.

Deer: Most of the state (including Colorado County), Nov. 12, 1977-Jan. 1, 1978. An Oct. 131 archery season will be held in most counties. Quail will be in season in this area Nov. 12, 1977-Feb. 12, 1978.

Other significant game and fish action taken by the P&W Commission included:

Allowing bow hunters to hunt upland game during archery season by making it legal for them to have on their persons, in their hunting camp or automobile, a shotgun having shot no larger than number six size.

Seasons on migratory game birds such as ducks, geese and doves will be set by Parks and Wildlife Commissioners later in the year as frameworks become available from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.

License sales officials at the Parks and Wildlife Department say a total of 36,044 fishing licenses have been sold for the period September 1976 through March 1977, a drop of 76,962 for the same period a year ago. The decline represents a loss of some \$300,000 to the state.

A suit appealing an award made by the Texas Industrial Accident Board was filed in District Court April 19th.

The suit is styled Lorena Brune, also known as Lorena Barrera, against Twin City Fire Insurance Co. and Andrew Barrera. Both parties reside in Harris County.

On June 8, 1976 Henry J. Barrera, was killed while driving a concrete truck which was struck by a train in Columbus. The industrial accident board awarded half of the workman's compensation following the death to his mother, Mrs. Barrera and half to his father, Andrew Barrera.

The plaintiff contends that the couple was divorced in 1962 and that she has provided most of the care of the son and should be awarded "in excess of half of the amount" awarded by the board.
