plant would be \$25,113,000, for real estate \$273,960, for transmission lines \$5,022,000, and \$2,329,000 for contingency or a high cost of \$33,538,960. He also submitted a "low cost" for the facility, totaling \$25,615,290. Of this price, 200 would be for the plant, \$273,960 for real estate, \$5,022,000 for transmission and \$2,329,000 for contingency. He estimated cost of capital required would be 10% of the total cost, construction period of five years, economic life of 30 years; interest during construction of 10 percent and escalation during construction of five percent included. He played operating cost at \$1,981 kilowatt hour under high cost plant costs; and \$1,924 per kilowatt hour under the "low cost" plant cost.

Pleasanton Man Charged In Alleyton Burglary

A burglary at the James W. Brown residence on Route 2, Alleyton, was solved quickly by the Colorado County Sheriff's Department this week. James W. Brooks reported to the department at 11 a.m. Saturday that his home had been broken into and missing were: three saddles, one bridle, one pair of pants, one shirt, two hunting knives and a carton of cigarettes. Brown told the officers that earlier on the morning of the 29th a Billy Ray La Grange, 24 of Pleasanton, Texas had called at his home, though looking for a friend, though while La Grange became involved in a traffic accident in which his car was totaled on the evening of the 29th and a check of his vehicle revealed a saddle on the front seat and all of the other missing items elsewhere in the car. La Grange was arrested on the charge of burglary from the Eagle Lake Community Hospital and he was charged with burglary in the second degree. He is being held in the county jail with a bond of \$2000 set on each of the two charges. The case will go before the September grand jury.
