House Speaker Bill Clayton has presented Representative John Wilson with a commemorative gavel, acknowledging the La Grange representative's work as chairman of the Health and Welfare Committee during the 66th session of the Texas Legislature.

Within the House, the Health and Welfare Committee has jurisdiction over matters pertaining to welfare programs, the State Department of Welfare, public health, mental health and mental retardation.

Rep. Wilson, serving his second term in the House, was lauded by Clayton for his efforts on behalf of the committee system during the five month session which began in January.

"It is only through dedicated leadership that our system of government can work effectively and efficiently," Rep. Wilson is representative of the type of leaders we have in the House," Clayton said.

The Health and Welfare Committee has taken action on 177 bills during the session. The total pieces of legislation introduced by both Houses of the Legislature is about 4,000.



Gross Sales In Texas Continue To Climb

State Comptroller Bob Bullock reported Friday that gross sales in Texas for the last three months of 1976 exceeded \$43.3 billion, raising the total for the year to \$142.4 billion.

This is \$27.5 billion more than the total for calendar 1975, an increase of 23.9 percent, Bullock noted.

The computer analyses released by Bullock break down reported gross sales by county and by Standard Metropolitan Statistical Area (SMSA).

Colorado County has 594 reporting outlets for sales tax purposes and gross sales reported for these totaled \$36,834,520 including \$15,340,871 in gross taxable sales and \$21,493,649 in tax. Lavaca County \$27,187,330; and Wharton County \$57,671,229.
