A&M Team Picks Columbus Site for LCRA Recreation

Lists 4 Other Recommendations At Meeting Thurs.

A team of Texas A&M researchers headed by Dr. Frank Suggitt, aired recommendations which the survey team will make to the Lower Colorado River Authority relative to potential development of recreational facilities in a ten county area in the county courtroom in Columbus last Thursday.
