Rice Counselors Report to Board

Counselors of the Rice Consolidated Independent School District presented annual reports to the school board at the monthly meeting Monday, June 13th.

Making informative reports to the board were the Rice District's junior high school counselor Mrs. Helen Glover, vocational counselor Guy Reese, Jr., and Rice High School counselor William Carpenter.

Mrs. Glover told the board that she has completed her first year as counselor on the junior high level and proudly reported that all goals had been reached.

She stressed the importance of the career education programs in the sixth grade at Eagle Lake and fifth and sixth grades in Sheridan. She added that plans are to expand the career education program to the 8th grade students in the 1977-78 school year.

Other projects undertaken during the year were utilization of community resource personnel as speakers for career education classes; administration of tests to indicate career direction; and counseling with students and parents or guardians on personal, social and academic problems.

She said that the counseling program takes up most of her time and she stressed the importance of the student as an individual and commented that her goal will be for the "total development of the whole child."

She noted that there were no drop-outs in the Eagle Middle School during the year.

Rep. Wilson Right-Way Bill Passes

By Rep. John Wilson The 65th Texas Legislature passed House Bill 971, the Right-Way Bill, on May 30th at midnight.

Mr. Wilson reported that the bill was passed by a vote of 50 to 0 in the House and 20 to 0 in the Senate.

The bill will require the Texas Department of Highways and Public Transportation to increase its share of the costs of acquiring right-of-way from the present 50 percent to 90 percent.

Mr. Wilson said that the bill will save the state \$2 million annually and will provide for the construction of 100 miles of new highway.



STATE CAPITAL Highlights AND Sidelights

AUSTIN - Gov. Dolph Briscoe cleared his desk of legislation passed during the regular session and announced he will call lawmakers back to work July 11.

Briscoe settled on the early July date for an special session on the complex issue of public school finance which evaded all earlier efforts at solution.

"I think it should be possible to accomplish the work of the session in a week to 10 days," Briscoe said. "There is enough agreement that we should be able to work out a good school finance bill in a relatively short period of time... I am giving everybody an opportunity to plan around the July 11 date."

House Speaker Bill Clayton and Lt. Gov. Bill Hobby have indicated they favor the legislature's early passage of something similar to the conference committee report which died on final night of the regular session. The bill provided about \$900 million in additional school aid.

EER, fortunately, isn't as mysterious as it may sound. EER stands for Energy Efficiency Ratio, and is simply a measurement of cooling delivered for energy consumed.

In air conditioning, the higher the EER number on the system you choose, the more efficiently it operates. And that means savings for you on electric bills.

Air conditioners with the same cooling capacity may vary greatly in their efficiency, with some using more electricity than others to achieve the same level of cooling. By comparing EER numbers, you can determine which unit will do the most efficient job.

Although the air conditioner with the highest EER may cost more initially, it is a better long-range investment, since you will be able to run it with fewer dollars' worth of electricity. Look for a high EER number - preferably 8 or more - when you buy an air conditioner. It's an important way to use energy wisely.
