Pecan Spray is Advised

To spray approximate date August 5-20.

Homeowners can use the following formulation: Water, three gallons; Malathion, two tablespoons; Sevin, 80% wettable, two tablespoons; Benlate, 1% teaspoon.

Orchard owners can use one of the following insecticides in 100 gallons of water: Guthion, 1 1/2 pounds 25 percent wettable powder (Do not spray livestock in treated groves for 21 days); Zolene, 1 1/2 pints (do not spray livestock); Fungicide; Benlate, 1/2 pound, 50 percent wettable powder.

Report Feed Grain Acreage By Sept. 1

Due to certain new provisions in pending legislation, there may be a need for determining total crop and land use acreage for the total cropland on all farms for 1977, according to information received by the County ANS office, reports Executive Director Dan Strickland. Therefore, any feed grains not reported to date in this office should be taken care of as the final reporting date has been extended to September 1, 1977.

Those who have already reported their feed grains may at their convenience drop by this office to report any acreage of crops that were not reported on their first visit, till September 1, 1977.

Crop Disaster Provisions of the program covering rice, cotton or feed grain provide if due to a natural disaster or certain other causes beyond your control that you have a crop loss, you may be eligible for a disaster payment, added Strickland. If you fit into this category, contact the County ANS office before making any disposition of the crop or its remains. This office is required to check these farms for measurements and make any appraisal that is necessary of the disaster area. Contact the County ANS office for further details.

Soil Conservation News

District cooperative Eugene Harbeck of the Mentz area is planning to construct a pond for livestock water.

Messie Lee Edinger, a district cooperater of the Weimar area, has completed a drainage culled area which will be established in bermudagrass in control erosion.

William Ruzley, a district cooperater of the Weimar area, has added Coastal bermudagrass on gullied areas which were recently shaped.

Arthur Beke has seeded common bermudagrass on eroded areas which were shaped on his farm near Oakland.

Will Shaw is planning to shape gullied areas on the Shaw Bros. farm near Weimar.

District cooperater Verne Wanjura of the Weimar area is planning to shape gullied areas and establish bermudagrass to control erosion.

Alvin Klueber, a district cooperater of the Weimar area, is constructing a pond for livestock water.

A soil and water conservancy plan is being developed on the Jim Boyd farm near New Berlin.

Loans are repayable at six percent interest calculated on a daily basis. These are "non-recourse" loans, and if commodity loans are not repaid by maturity -- 11 months from disbursement -- CTV will take over ownership of the grain at no expense of interest to the producer.

EXTENDED COVERAGE

Gasoline is a useful servant that helps us use motor-loads, camp stoves, power mowers, and other garden tools. It's also a hazard--more than 13,500 persons a year are badly enough injured by the liquid fuel to seek emergency-room treatment.

For protection, always use a safety can for storage. It should be equipped with a pouring outlet (with or without a flexible nozzle) and a tight-fitting cap or nozzle. There must be a vent for vapors. Look for the UL listing mark.

The container should be stored in a cool, well-ventilated area. Keep it safe from tipping or other damage. NEVER store it in a car trunk.

Never siphon gasoline by mouth. Even a few drops in your lungs could cause fatal damage.

Gasoline should not be used as a spot cleaner for clothing, as a paint brush cleaner, as an insect exterminator, or to start a fire. Less explosive fuels are available for those purposes.

Treat gasoline with care, for your own protection. Get more protection with adequate insurance for all your needs. See the experts at
