

Rotary Has Program On Work of RC&D

Connie Fair, Roll Conservationist for the Colorado Roll and Water Conservation District, was the guest speaker at the meeting of the Eagle Lake Rotary Club on Wednesday of last week and brought an interesting program on work of the Resource Conservation and Development Districts.

Fair showed a slide film on the formation and functions of the Sam Houston RC&D in which this county is located.

Colorado is one of ten counties included in the Sam Houston RC&D Council and several projects in this county are under consideration through the use of the federally-funded programs of the RC&D.

Roadside soil erosion projects in Commissioners' Precincts 2 and 3 are under consideration and studies are now underway for assistance with improving drainage in the creek which traverses the Eagle Lake Recreation Center, crosses under Highway 90A (South McCarty) and flows south into Eagle Lake.

Fair noted that the City of Eagle Lake became a member of the Sam Houston RC&D Council in 1968 under the administration of Harold Thomas as mayor of the city. The drainage program is now being supported by the present mayor, Elmer Struss, and members of the city council and studies on the effect of the drainage program on wildlife and the environment are underway in accordance with federal regulations, noted the conservationist.

Here's how to do it:

Dial 0 (zero) immediately followed by the Area Code (if different from your own) + the number.

When the Operator asks, "May I help you?" tell her on a ...
Person call: "I'm calling (name)."

Collect call: "This is a Collect call. My name is ..."

Credit Card Call: "My Credit Card Number is ..."

Third Number Call: "Charge this call to Area Code number ..."

Southwestern Bell's newest improvement in Long Distance telephone service has been added to the Eagle Lake area and now you will be able to dial virtually all Long Distance calls yourself.

As you know, you've been able to dial Station-to-Station calls direct with One-Plus Dialing. With Zero-Plus Dialing you will also be able to dial Person-to-Person, Collect, Credit Card and Bill-to-Third-Number calls.

On Station-to-Station calls—which do not involve an Operator—you still Dial 1 + the Area Code (if different from your own) + the number.

We suggest that you continue to use One-Plus Dialing whenever possible because there's no cheaper way to call Long Distance. But if you cannot use One-Plus, Zero-Plus will save you time on your operator handled calls.

Zero-Plus Dialing is also available at coin telephones.
