(Continued from page one) In a complete schedule, EL Primary School Eagle Lake Primary School Principal Major Benge released a list of the pupil assignments for kindergarten through third grade and the list may be found on page 10 of this issue. He said that around 307 pupils are expected for the opening of the 1977-78 term next Thursday, August 25th. This compares with 370 expected at the start of 1976-77.

The first bell rings at the Primary School at 8:05 a.m. and the tardy bell at 8:15 a.m. except morning kindergarten classes dismissed at 8 a.m. The same bus routes that were in effect last year will run again this year.

The principal said teachers will maintain on duty daily until 5:30 p.m. for consultation with parents, if desired. Lunch hours at the Primary School will be 11:30 a.m. to 11:45 a.m. The campus is closed and no students will be allowed to leave the campus for lunch, except for special cases.

EL Middle School Eagle Lake Middle School homework assignments for the 460 students expected at the Eagle Lake Middle School August 25th are listed elsewhere in this issue by the principal James Cook.

The first bell will sound at Garwood at 8:10 a.m. and the tardy bell at 8:15 a.m. Classes for the kindergarten students will continue until 11:25 when the children are dismissed home or stay at school and out and then go home. The first and second graders will get out at 2:25 p.m. and the

remainder of the grades, three through eight, at 2:30 p.m. Sheridan Elementary W. C. Gohlike, principal at the Sheridan School, reports that all is in readiness for the opening of the new school year. The first bell rings at Sheridan at 8:05 a.m. and the tardy bell at 8:15 a.m. and classes dismiss at 3:15 p.m. Kindergarten classes will be held in the mornings from 8:15 a.m. to 11 a.m.
