**Periodic Motor Vehicle Inspection Proven To Be A Gas Saver**

**Hubenak Is Candidate For Ag. Commr.**

State Representative Joe A. Hubenak, Texas' foremost authority on agriculture, last week formally announced his candidacy for Commissioner of Agriculture.

Hubenak declared that his election will be "engineered a serious approach" to the problems facing the farming and ranching industry and the consumer in Texas.

Hubenak stated that while more than 25% of the Texas labor force are employed in agriculture and agribusiness, the state still lost more than 2,000 farms and ranches in 1976 alone.

"I believe that the agriculture upon which much of our economic survival is based is at the stage that our oil and gas industry faced a decade ago. Nothing is being done to save it," he stated.

"Agriculture in Texas must not become a mistreated stepchild, and we need to institute new ideas and new programs to bolster the production and incomes of our farm and ranch population."

Hubenak, representing Fort Bend County and part of Brazoria County, has been a member of the Texas House of Representatives for the last 10 years, and has served as chairman of the powerful Agriculture and Livestock Committee for the last three terms, or six years. Hubenak also serves as vice-chairman of the 15 Southern State Agricultural Conference.

During his tenure in the House, Hubenak has successfully guided many major bills into law to benefit consumers and the farm and ranch industry including:

- Passage of the Public Grain Warehousing Act; passage of increased agricultural research; passage of the Texas Vegetable Marketing Act; increases in the Brucellosis Research Program.
- Also, increases in the imported fire ant research and control program; increases in veterinary medicine programs; passage of numerous Texas feed laws and farm cooperative legislation; passage of changes in the state sales tax law as it affects the agribusiness community.

**East Bernard School Tax Rate Lowered 5¢**

The School Board of the East Bernard Independent School District met in a special meeting on Wednesday, Aug. 17th at 8:00 p.m. to hold a public hearing on the 1977-78 school budget.

The tax valuation in the district was estimated at \$53,584,648. This is an increase of approximately \$6,200,000 over 1976-77 due to increase caused primarily by new gas production.

Local revenue sources was estimated at \$24,658, state sources \$651,484, and surpluses at \$85,000, for a total of \$1,641,157.

The budget was unanimously adopted totaling \$1,629,507 and the rate was set at \$35 for bond service, and \$1.32 for operation for a total of \$1.67. This is a reduction of 5¢ per \$100 valuation. East Bernard Tribune.
