Tax on Mixed Drinks Generates \$156 Million

Comptroller Bob Bullock said last week that the state tax on mixed drinks has generated over \$156 million in revenue for the state, and counties since its inception six years ago.

An analysis of the mixed drink excise receipts tax was included in the Comptroller's August monthly financial statement.

The monthly statement also includes a report on a bill pending in the Louisiana Legislature to tax the processing of natural gas collected from federal lands in the Gulf and a guide to the 1977-78 Texas appropriations act which is effective September 1.

Reflections On International Sunday School Lesson

(Titus 3:1-11; 1 Peter 2:13-17)

What person you know demonstrates what that person really is. This is one of the reasons why making laws and setting rules can never provide a perfect answer to human problems. Laws and rules may provide limited protection for the innocent. The only permanent way to improve human behavior is to change the people themselves. This is one of the reasons why Jesus said, "Out of the heart are the issues of life." He simply meant that the heart is the fountain out of which all our thoughts and actions flow.

The Apostle Paul said basically the same thing. In the third chapter of the letter to Titus he spoke about the responsible people Christians should be in society. In the middle of this discussion he declared: "But when the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared, he saved us, not because of deeds done by us in righteousness, but in virtue of his own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal in the Holy Spirit."

God intervenes in the human problem and changes the nature of the people who place their faith in him. Those people have a new nature and are able to do what he has intended for them as a new kind of living beings.

Christians should respect the laws of society. They should be the best citizens of their community. Their honesty and loyalty in matters related to the government should be above question. Industry should characterize Christians in both their religious and secular work. They should be courteous, gentle, and thoughtful. Criticism and quarreling should be avoided. Paul mentioned some characteristics of people who have not entered God's grace. These must be carefully avoided. They are: "Think only of yourself, a prodigal, a hater, disobedient, low resistance to temptations, and contemptuous to apostles and messengers." Christians can be free from all of these.

Occasionally a Christian will be guilty of sin. Sin. Properly there may be some failure to live up to Christ's standards. Both Paul and Peter indicated that when this happens God will chastise us as a parent does a disobedient child. The purpose of the punishment is to stimulate better behavior later.
