Reflections On International Sunday School Lesson

[Daniel 1:3-5; 8:1-7]

A retired baseball player had just been inducted into baseball's Hall of Fame. A sports writer asked how he had developed his skills in fielding and throwing the ball. Some men have natural skills in both areas. I had to improve on what nature gave me through extra hours of daily practice, even when the season was over, he replied.

The reporter titled his story from this interview: "Discipline leads to greatness." In the article he observed: "Too many of today's great talents are squandered by men who are too lazy or too undisciplined to develop them. This man's ability to achieve greatness with more limited talent is a shining reminder of the magic power of disciplined labor."

The Bible has a number of such examples. Daniel is one of them. This young man came from the royal family of Judah. He grew up under the influence of his father, Shadrach, a godly king. His life was also touched by the influence of Jeremiah, the great prophet. He had the negative example of Belshazzar, the evil ruler who finally brought Judah's downfall. In 597 B.C. Daniel was exiled to Babylon when Nebuchadnezzar destroyed Jerusalem. Daniel was about twenty years of age. His excellent education and background made him a threat to the conquerors, if he remained in his homeland. In Babylon, it was felt that he could be "retrained" to serve the conquering king well.

Daniel, along with several of his peers, was placed in a three-year training program. He had his name changed. Daniel meant "God is my judge." His captors called him Belshazzar, meaning "Bel's Prince." A new diet, language, and religion were all a part of their program. Daniel refused to change his diet or his faith. He secured permission to prove that his own diet would make him more healthy and his very faith more wise. His example of discipline and dedication made him an evidence that God stands by those who are faithful to him. For more than six decades Daniel became the central figure in the religious life of the exiles and a key leader in the government of a foreign power.

When Daniel first chose the road of loyalty to God and discipline to his teachings, it was a difficult
