Provident City Appeals To TEA

The Provident City Independent School District, which faces possible annexation to the Hallettsville School District due to action taken by four area county school boards, has filed a notice of appeal with the Texas Education Agency.

Wharton, Lavaca, Jackson and Colorado County school boards voted to annex the Provident District to the Hallettsville District. In the unanimous order passed by the four school boards, annexation was to become effective Dec. 31st. However, William H. Bingham, an Austin attorney representing Provident City, filed the notice of appeal before the annexation date with Dr. M. L. Brockett, commissioner of education, Texas Education Agency.

Bingham said in his appeal that "Provident City Independent School District gives notice of appeal from certain action taken by four county school boards which appears to be one step in an overall plan to divide the Provident City District among various school districts."

A hearing has been set on the issue Tuesday, March 21st at 9 a.m. but this hearing date may be changed due to a conflict in the attorney's schedule. Bingham has been reported as saying that the procedure of the hearing will be for both Hallettsville and Provident City to give testimony and after the hearing the commissioner of education will hand down his opinion. If either party is dissatisfied with the opinion, it can be appealed to the State Board of Education, then to a District Court, and possible other courts.
