Both men were charged through Justice of the Peace Court of M. M. Jones and bond set at \$1,000 each pending hearing of the misdemeanor cases in County Court.

Rice Girls Meet Hardin For Bi-District Tuesday

Beat Willis, 73-52 For Bi-District Title Mon. Nite

Lonnie Bluntson scored 32 points and grabbed 13 rebounds to lead the Rice High School Raider Boys to the bi-district championship over Willis in Prairie View A&M Gym Monday night.

The 17 senior point guard missed the final two regular season games because of an ankle injury but made up for lost time with an impressive performance in the 73-52 bi-district victory.

The Raiders now advance to the Region III Playoff tournament to be held at Blinn Junior College in Brenham this Friday and Saturday. Rice will meet Hardin-Jefferson in first round action at 7:00 p.m. Fri. with Marble Falls and Crockett matched in the other game. The two winners will meet Saturday night at 7:30 to determine the region winner who will advance to the state tournament in Austin on March 1, 2 and 3.

The Raiders, coached by Jack Grammer and Gil Staibbaum, dominated play with the District 19AA champions, Willis, in Monday night's bi-district action.

Rice opened fire early and pulled to a comfortable lead after one quarter. Rice connected on all shots during the first three minutes of the game and threatened to put the game away early.

Bluntson, who scored 15 of his points in the first half, and John Grammer, 6-2 senior guard, who ended the night with 18 points, led

the starters to a 37-20 first half lead.

Despite a cold shooting second half, the Raiders maintained complete control of game starting a stout defensive effort. The Raiders, with an obvious height advantage, controlled the boards and intimidated Willis shooters throughout the contest.

Larry Haynes, 6-5 sophomore forward, and Dennis Bluntson, 6-0 junior forward, each scored eight points to help in the victory for Rice. Junior guard

Darryl Axel turned in a fine defensive performance for the Raiders and added four points to his score.

All Raiders saw action in the contest as Grammer pulled his starters with two and a half minutes left in the game. Other players for Rice were Stephen Spanibel, Madison Smith, Darrel Appelt, David Grammer, Ernest Fields, Victor Davis and Mike Johnson.

Coach Wunderlich, in his ninth season as the Raider mentor, picked up his 1979 win with 73 losses in Tuesday night's district finale at Raider Gym. The title marks the fourth

district championship captured by the Raiders under Wunderlich and will add another banner to the impressive Raider Gym.

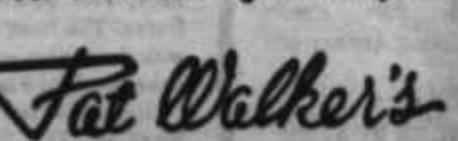
