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Farm Bureau Week March 5 - 10

County Farm Bureau President James Adkins of Eagle Lake has joined Governor Bill Clements in designating the week of March 5-10 as Farm Bureau Week. Colorado County Farm Bureau ended its 1978 fiscal year with 1766 member families. The present Texas Farm Bureau membership totals 228,079 member families in 212 Texas counties.

Membership chairman for Colorado County Farm Bureau is Leon Hatterman of Weimar, according to President Adkins. Committeemen are Ewald Brandt and Weimar and Billy Hefner of Garwood.

The effectiveness of the state's largest agricultural organization was shown through the overwhelming victory of the Tax Relief Amendment in the November 7th general election. County Farm Bureau is working on other problems, such as inflation, threat of export controls, foreign ownership of land, parity prices and land-use proposals.

One of the more common grasses in the world, 'Shoreline' is found mostly in marshes, along rivers, and at streambeds and canal banks. It was developed from a strain discovered by SCS personnel on a railroad right-of-way in Kaufman County in 1970.

'Cattle have destroyed stands by severe overgrazing,' added Fair, 'so common reed must be protected from livestock all the time. We've seen families could afford to purchase homes.
