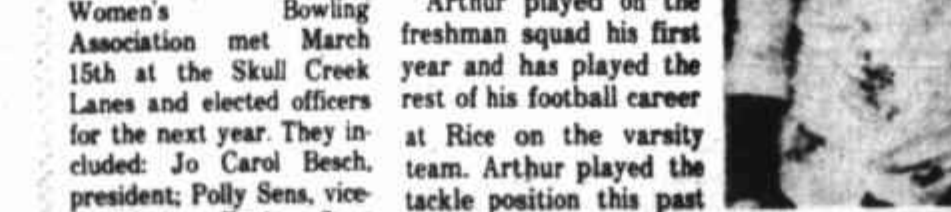
Raiders Finish Fifth in Palacios Sat. The Rice Raider boys' track team took fifth place honors in their competition in the Palacios Relays held last Saturday.

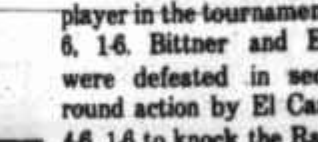
Tennis Team In Boling Tournery Fri.

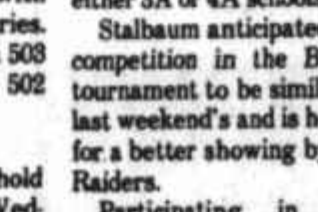

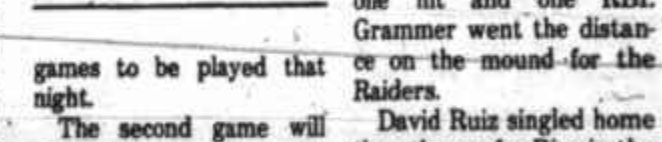
Raider Nine Home For 2 Games, Fri. and Mon.
