Keep Livestock Off Roadways And Highways

I would like to ask all our citizens who own or control livestock to please make every effort to keep their livestock from wandering on roadways. We are all aware that from time to time our livestock will get out on the roadway in spite of everything we do; however, we should make sure that our fences are in a state of repair which will prevent this. The law provides for livestock found on roadways to be brought to the Auction Barn and the owner be required to pay all expenses and also for the feeding of the livestock while at the barn. If the owner fails to pay for this his livestock may be sold at public auction; the bills paid out of the proceeds, and any money left over would go to the County Treasurer. We are doing everything in our power to prevent this, however, we do need the assistance of all livestock owners.

Cong. Pickle Supports Treaty

The eyes of the world were on Washington earlier this week as President Carter and members of Congress witnessed the signing of the Middle East peace treaty by Israeli and Egyptian leaders, Menachem Begin and Anwar Sadat.

We felt thankful, but not yet at ease. For the security of this treaty is a far sight from being locked in concrete.

I am basically in support of the treaty and the U.S. role in accomplishing it. The \$5 billion price tag of military assistance to both countries is high, and at this point the details of the proposed aid are unknown. The package will receive an independent review by Congress. I know I will give it close study.

Peace in the Middle East is vital to U.S. interests. Any threat of armed conflict there is a threat to world peace because of the strong U.S. and Soviet commitments and influences in the region. We must remember, too, that until about 1970 the Soviet influence in Egypt was very strong, but that it has declined to almost nil at this time. The waning of Soviet influence in Egypt is a great success
