On Friday, Jeri Lippenott, who was believed to be the drowned subject's father, was contacted at Bergstrom AFB in Austin, where he is stationed with the Air Force. He was told that it was believed to be his son that was removed from the river and that officers needed assistance in identifying the body. He assisted by giving officers his son's dentist's name and telephone number for possible identification through dental works; however, Lippenott stated that he would be out of town on Air Force business over the weekend and if it was determined that the subject was his son Monday morning, the 2nd day of April, Prints were taken from the drowned victim and taken to Travis County sheriff's office in Austin where Lippenott's prints were on file and positive identification was made through these prints.

Was On Probation
 Officers reported he was on probation from Travis County on drug charges. The parents were notified that positive identification had been made and that the subject was their son. They were instructed to claim the remains with the Medical Examiner's office in Houston. The investigation continues as sheriff's officers have not ruled out foul play. Investigators are attempting to locate two people who were seen with Lippenott on Friday, March 23rd; and also his girl friend who is believed to have seen him sometime Saturday, March 24th when they met somewhere between Columbus and Austin where Lippenott gave her his mother's car to be returned to Austin.

The victim's father contacted the sheriff's office at noon on Friday and stated that his son's remains were being cremated in Houston. He also stated that since things have calmed down and he had had time to think, he wanted to help the sheriff's department in the investigation of his son's death. He gave sheriff's investigators names of subjects in Austin who might help in the investigation.

 type of pension plan was needed to encourage employment with the city to help stop the large turnover of city employees, and to give the employees some type of opportunity for security in the future.

The plan presented, according to Appelt, was the most practical and most flexible, and required no administration by the city.

City Manager T. J. Smith told the council that funds for a retirement plan had been allocated in the budget for the past two or three years, in case one would have been adopted, and added that it would be in the budget again this year.

The approval of adopting a retirement plan is expected to be given, the only problem left is finding a plan that will work best for the city. That decision should be made at the council's April 24th meeting.

Other Action
 In other action last Tuesday, the council approved a resolution in favor of a proposed express bus route between Dallas and Houston for the Greyhound Bus Lines. The route, according to bus line officials, will improve the transportation, as well as delivery system to Eagle Lake.

Refund
 The council approved a payback of \$3200 to the Eagle Lake Development Co. in accordance with their agreement in the Ridgeless Subdivision. The refund was made for lots purchased by George Matthys and Bill Fink.

Drive Openings
 A request by the Dennis Simpsons was made to the city to open 20-foot driveway openings along the west side of Austin Road.

It was noted that the Simpsons did not participate in the payment of curb and guttering along that road, now under construction. (The funds for the project were acquired through another source.)

The council, feeling no obligation to OK the request, did vote to approve it upon the payment of \$10 a foot or a total of \$400 by the Simpsons.

Truck Deliveries Soon
 It was also reported last Tuesday that the delivery of the city's new garbage truck could be expected in less than four weeks, and delivery of the new fire truck in about two months.

5-Time Loser Charged Again In County

A man, previously convicted and who has served time in the Texas Department of Corrections each time on 5 various charges, ran afoul of the law in this county Saturday night after creating a disturbance at a residence east of Columbus.

At around 9:30 p.m. Saturday, March 31st, Mentha Williams called the Colorado County sheriff's office and reported that she needed an officer to check a disturbance at her residence east of Columbus. She stated the disturbance was being caused by an Alfred Don Richardson. She also stated that he had a gun with him.

When officers arrived at the residence, Richardson was leaving the place in a vehicle. His path was blocked by the sheriff's officer and he was told to get out of the vehicle. It was reported that Richardson first opened the door of his car and then instead of getting out of the vehicle, closed the door and reached on the front seat of the vehicle and picked something up. He reportedly raised the item toward the officer where it was observed to be a chrome-plated pistol. He was told to drop the gun and get out of the vehicle. Mrs. Williams stood in the line of fire between the officer and Richardson, obstructing the officer in the event it would have been necessary to use his weapon.

Richardson finally placed the gun on the front seat of the car and got out of the vehicle with his hands in the air. Further investigation revealed that he was being sought by the Department of Public Safety officers for a hit and run accident. Richardson was arrested and charged with aggravated assault and unlawful possession of firearms by a felon.

A check of the man's record revealed that he had been in the Texas Department of Corrections five times on charges of robbery, assault, burglary and larceny. He was also fined a total of \$81.00 for traffic offenses by Justice of the Peace Richard Schmidt.

Richardson, a colored male, 60 years of age, residing in Alleyton, remains in the County Jail in lieu of \$4,000 in bonds set by J.P. Richard Schmidt. The district attorney is expected to present evidence in the case to the next Grand Jury in an attempt to have Richardson convicted as a habitual criminal. If convicted he would receive life in prison, according to the County Sheriff's Dept.

Commr.'s Court OK's Bldg. For J.P.; To Sell Used Cars

To Discuss Fund Division At Meeting April 23
 Colorado County Commissioners' Court met in regular session Monday and among numerous items of business handled during the meeting, approved the purchase of an office building for the Peace Mary Order; approved advertising for the sale of several used cars from the county sheriff's department; set a hearing for load limits on several county roads; and delayed until the special meeting on Monday, April 23rd the thorny issue of division of road funds to the four commissioners' precincts.

JP Order appeared before the court Monday to request the purchase of a 16' x 18' portable building from Harry Horndt for \$1680.00 for use as an office at her home in Precinct 5.

She presented statistics on the great increase of business handled by her court noting that in the past thirteen months, ending Mar. 31, 1979, she had handled 462 cases which brought in fines of \$16,013.55.

She told the commissioners that she handled a total of 683 cases in all [not including 25 failure to show cases] during that period. About sixty-five percent of these were tickets written to truck operators in the area which is having a great increase in gravel trucking activities.

High Fine Schedule
 In discussing the schedule of fines in her court, she said that the schedule is reported to be the highest in the county.
