Water Bath Canner
For high acid foods such as tomatoes, fruits and pickled vegetables, the appropriate equipment is a water bath canner. This could be any large pan with straight sides, a cover and the pan to keep jars from resting on the bottom of the pan thus allowing water to move freely around the jars.

Use a pan that is deep enough to allow the jars tops to be covered one to two inches and have space to gently boil.

Large soup kettles could serve as water bath canners.

Use Mason Jars
No matter what method of canning, use only standard, mason jars made especially for canning.

These usually have the name of the manufacturer on the side and are heat tempered to withstand steam pressure during processing and vacuum after cooling.
