Prehearing Meet On Proposed Allen's Creek Nuclear Plant

The presiding Atomic Safety and Licensing Board held a pre-hearing conference Wednesday in Houston, in the Nuclear Regulatory Commission proceeding on the application of Houston Lighting and Power Company to build the proposed Allen's Creek nuclear generating station in Austin County.

The conference began at 9:30 a.m. and if necessary, it will continue the next day.

The purpose of the conference is to prepare for the evidentiary hearing to be held at a later date. Matters to be taken up at the conference include simplification of the issues; the need for amending the pleadings; obtaining stipulations and admissions of fact; identification of witnesses; setting a hearing schedule; and any other matters that may aid in the orderly disposition of the proceeding.

The public is welcome to attend the conference. However, there will be no opportunity for limited appearance statements by the public until the beginning of the evidentiary hearing. Persons who wish to state their views by way of limited appearance are required to inform the Secretary of the Commission, Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Washington, D.C. 20555.

They will be notified of the time and place at which the limited appearance statements will be received by the board.

Death Of El Campo Girl Is Homicide

After nearly two weeks of waiting, Fort Bend County law enforcement officers received the autopsy report on Dianne Lynn "Dink" Gajdos, a 17-year-old El Campo High School student, whose body was found Monday, March 26 in a rice canal near Richmond.

The report, according to Chief Deputy Joe Thorpe, Fort Bend County Sheriff's Department, confirmed what was suspected - what was homicide.

The autopsy, received in Richmond Tuesday afternoon, April 10th, indicated that Gajdos, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Walter Lipinski of El Campo, was asphyxiated by suffocation.

Concerning the investigation, Thorpe said his office has only "very slim leads at the present time." - El Campo Leader-News.
