## Referrals Now Being Taken For Early Childhood Classes For Handicapped Children of the Rice Consolidated School District

There is an Early Childhood class for handicapped children of the Rice Consolidated Independent School District located on the Eagle Lake Primary School campus. Referrals are now being accepted for the 1979-80 school year. Children eligible for this class must be at least three years of age by September 1, and have a problem that might affect future educational progress. Such a problem might be indicated by one or more of the following:

- delay in language and/or speech;
- poor coordination skills;
- hearing or vision problems;
- seems not to listen or understand when spoken to;
- cannot carry out simple directions;
- does not put sounds in words together properly;
- cannot remember what he/she hears;
- rarely talks, or uses one word sentences;
- slow to learn (such as walking, talking, toilet training, feeding self, etc.);
- physically handicapped or other health impaired.

If you have a child you feel might be eligible, or know of someone who does, please contact the school principal, Major Benga, at 234-3881. A representative of the school will then contact you for detailed information about the child's problem.
