**Kinggrass - an Impressive Forage**

Kinggrass Selection-75 is an excellent pasture forage. The warm-season perennial is readily grazed by livestock. A tall-growing bunch grass, Kinggrass is relatively drought tolerant. It has a long growth period, producing green forage from the last spring frost until the first frost in the fall.

Tests for digestibility and protein content indicate that Kinggrass maintains good quality throughout its growth cycle. This allows more flexibility in grazing management without hurting animal performance.

Kinggrass has been used in rangeland plantings following brush control and as a pure stand in improved pastures and has performed well in both instances.

Despite all its advantages, Kinggrass is not a "wonder" grass. "Overhead" has been a problem in grazing sheep and goats. Thus far, no ill effects have been reported in cattle or horses.

Kinggrass is not a winter pasture forage. Green growth may occur around the base but not enough for grazing. Until the grass starts to grow again in the spring, standing dry forage may be grazed. However, a protein supplement should be fed, too.

Would you like to know more about Kinggrass? Almost anyone can plant their own pasture since a Kinggrass stand is established from seed. However, seed is too small and slick to plant with a standard grain drill, so a small seed box designed to meter out the recommended two pounds of seed per acre is needed.

**Sheriff's Dept. Investigates Four Thefts**

Colorado County sheriff's department investigated a rash of four incidents, one for theft of a pickup, two home burglaries and one for theft of a pump from a gravel pit, during the past week.

At 3:30 p.m. Saturday, Shorly Cochran, owner of Shorly's Auto Sales in Columbus reported that a 1977 Ford pickup had been taken from the store. A man reportedly took the vehicle on the pretext of buying the truck, but drove away with the truck on IH 10. Notice of the theft was put out by radio and the pickup was stopped three miles west of Brookshire on IH 10 by the highway patrol.

The driver, Gerald Lenard Van Worthing, 41, of North Hollywood, Calif., was charged in Justice of the Peace Court 1 with attempted rape and Judge Richard Schmidt set his bond at \$20,000.

The man was still in the county jail Wednesday, pending action by the next grand jury in this county.

**Determine "Normal" Weight**

Determine "normal" weight, then set a balanced diet of low-calorie foods, exercise daily and change eating habits to reach that weight.

One to two pounds of weight loss per week is the recommended safe amount to lose. Men and women can use this information for determining what their approximate normal weight should be based on their height and build:

- For a medium-built woman you allow 100 lbs. for the first 5 feet of height, plus 5 lbs. for each additional inch.
- For a medium-built man you allow 106 lbs. for the first 5 feet of height, plus 5 lbs. for each additional inch.

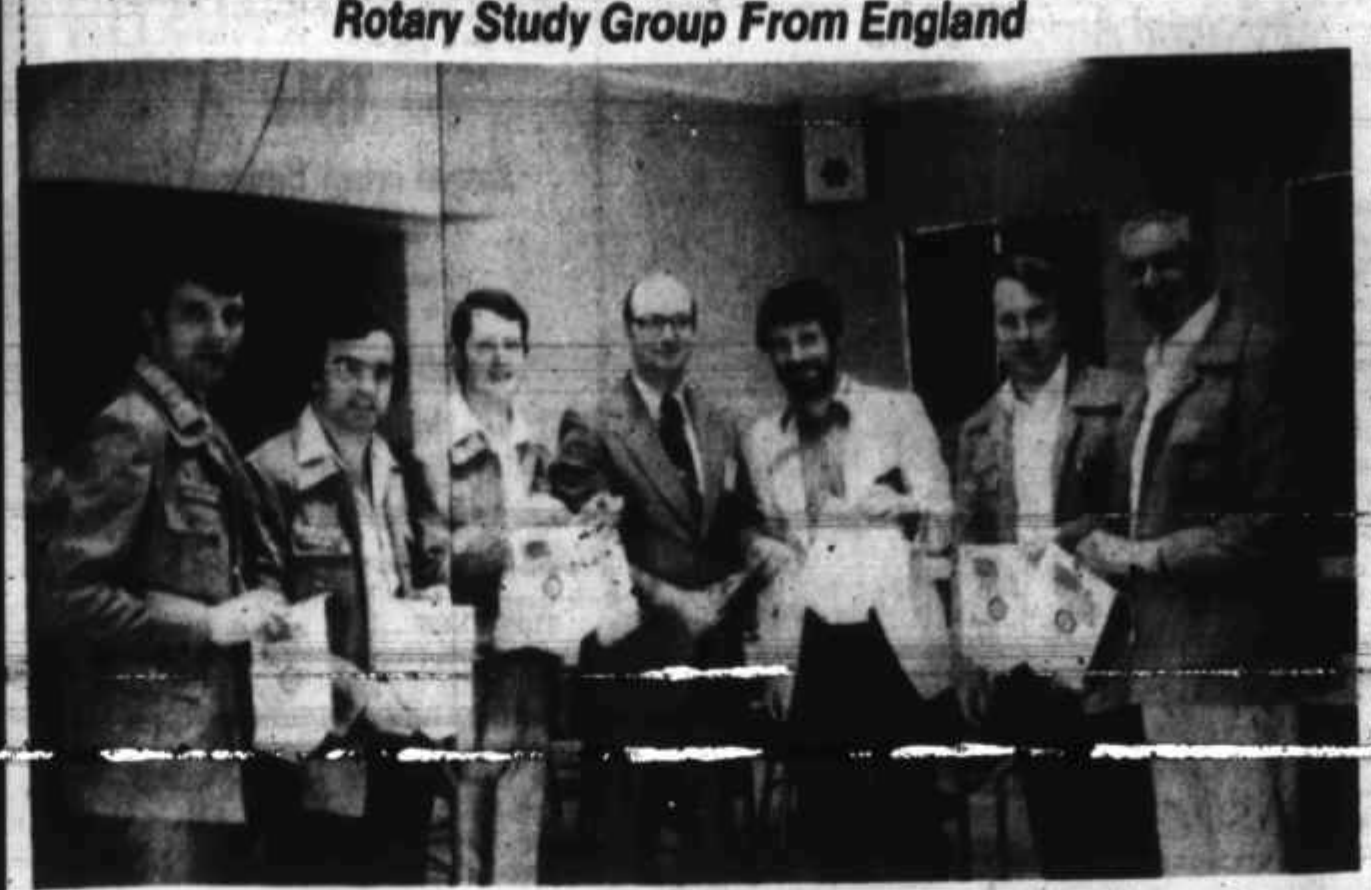
