Columbus Livestock Co. The market was a little lower across the board from the high market of last week, at the sale at Columbus Livestock Co. on Thursday, June 8th. The prices were, however, well in line with all major markets.

The firm handled 501 head of cattle. Good to choice butcher calves sold 70 to 75, heiferette packer cows sold 55 to 60, commercial packer bulls 65 to 70. Heavy Hereford and Angus steer calves and also Crossbred

steer calves sold 70 to 90 and heifers 70 to 80. Good stocker cows and heifers were \$450 to \$550 per head.

No. 1 hogs brought 39 to 41 and lambs 40 to 39.
