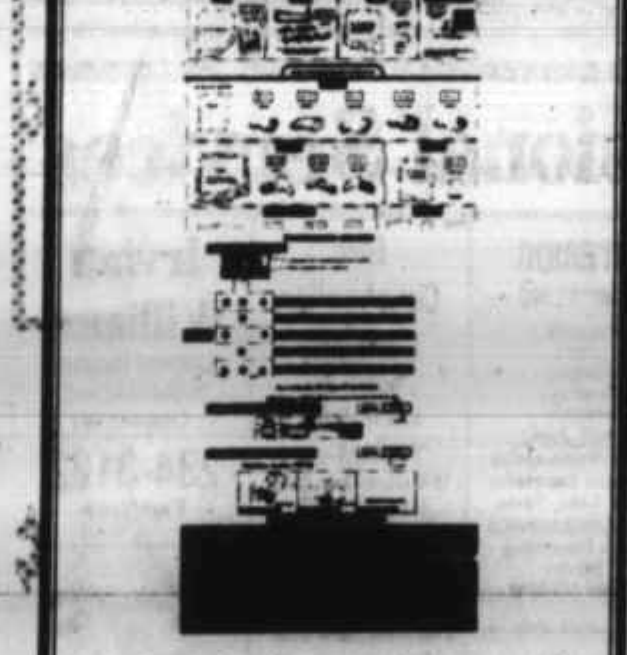

Cong. Archer Speaks At Prairie Rice Dinner In Houston

Need Pride In Our Country, Freedoms For Another 200 Great Years
Prairie Rice of Chesterville was the host for its annual dinner party in the beautiful La Hacienda De Los Morales in Houston on Monday evening of last week (July 2nd) and nearly two hundred persons enjoyed a wonderful meal and an inspiring address by the Honorable Bill Archer, United States Congressman from Houston.

The group traveled by chartered buses from the Chesterville location to Houston. La Hacienda De Los Morales, one of the most famous names internationally in continental cuisine, is represented in Houston by an almost exact replica of one of Mexico's most renowned haciendas, a facility that dates back to the 16th century.

Upon arrival in Houston, the group was met by the many, many Houston police, Harris County officers and others on the location. They later learned that a visiting thick and party were also having a dinner party in one of the reception and banquet areas of La Hacienda De Los Morales.

The group enjoyed a period of fellowship when an assortment of delicious hors d'oeuvres were served in the huge and beautifully appointed ballroom.

Miller is MC
Harold Miller, manager of Prairie Rice, presided as master of ceremonies for the evening and invited the guests to the dining area for a sumptuous meal of prime rib and trimmings.

He extended a welcome in behalf of Prairie Rice and expressed appreciation for the support of the dryer's facilities during the past year and said that "Prairie Rice is looking forward to serving rice and soybean producers of the area again in 1979."

He introduced special guests for the evening, employees of Prairie Rice and other distinguished persons invited for this special occasion.

Jay Anderson, owner of Prairie Rice, echoed Miller's sentiments and added his thanks for the opportunity to serve rice and soybean producers of the area.

He introduced as special guests the Rev. and Mrs. Bill Covillion. He is the new pastor of the United Methodist Church in Lissie and before giving the invocation, the new pastor presented some stirring remarks on the importance of agriculture. He described the important roles played by rice and soybean growers in the area, those of the agriculturally related businesses and industries, the important role played by wives and mother, the importance of church and religion in the American way of life, and finally, the role of the U. S. Government which Covillion described as "the greatest in the world."

"Agriculture is the key to the economic stability of the Eagle Lake, Lissie, Chesterville and East Bernard areas" (from which most of the guests came).

He added that all segments of domestic and international populations are dependent on each other for survival and stressed the importance of taking part in government.

The Rev. Mr. Covillion closed with the illustration paraphrasing the "popular expression, 'What's Cooking,' adding that 'many of us don't know what's cooking until it boils over.'"

Congressman Archer Speaks
The highlight of the occasion was the thoughtful, inspiring address by the Honorable Bill Archer, United States Congressman from Houston. Cong. Archer was introduced by Mr. Anderson as one well versed in the problems confronting agriculture since he was for a number of years an officer in Uncle Johnny's Mills.
