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Korenek Well Near Garwood Is Completed

The No. 8 Justine Korenek gas well 8.5 miles southeast of Garwood on a 628-acre lease in the S&A-MG RR Co. Survey A-582, has been completed as an extension of the Lyda Field.

The well was completed by Louis A. Newitt of Houston from perforations at 3,546 to 3,552 feet and the well flowed a maximum daily rate of 410,000 cubic feet of dry gas from a four-point test.

Absolute open flow on the well was 3.2 million cubic feet of gas per day from a total depth of 4,500 feet.

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
