Weimar Man Charged In Theft of Cattle

A Weimar man has been charged with felony theft for the theft of four head of cattle Monday from the Scott Bros. Ranch at Weimar.

Colorado County Sheriff Geo. (Doc) Mueller received word that the four head of cattle were missing at 10:30 a.m. A check was made at auction companies in the area and the cattle were located at a sales barn in Flatonia. A Fayette county deputy sheriff waited until the suspect picked up a check for sale of the cattle and then placed him under arrest at 1:30 p.m.

Charged with the theft was Eliaz Smith, 29, and he was charged in this county and placed under \$2500 bond. The sheriff's department reported that the man has admitted taking the cattle and is expected to waive grand jury indictment and make a plea in district court on Thursday of this week. Scott Bros. Ranch and Weimar have recovered their cattle.

3 Civil Suits Filed In District Court

Three civil suits were filed in District Court in Columbus during the past week, one for an alleged past due account, another for damages for loss of a horse and the other seeking an injunction against a pipeline crossing.

In a suit filed July 3rd by Theresa Gaddy and others against M. G. Inc. and others, a total of \$975.50 in damages plus attorneys fees and costs of court are asked in the death of a horse.

The plaintiff says the suit was filed in behalf of her husband James Gaddy and son, Wesley Gaddy and involves the purchase of two horses by the Gaddys on June 12th. One of the horses died and they contend that feed made by M. G. and purchased in Rock Island was faulty and contributed to the death of the animal.

Gaddy alleges also that the feed had been sold previously to another customer and returned because it was said to be faulty. The damages include \$500 for loss of the horse plus veterinary, hauling fees, phone calls and costs of the feed.

In a suit filed July 10th, Plaintiff Charles Co. Inc. seeks to collect an alleged past due account in the amount of \$11,765.65, plus costs of court and attorney's fees, from Brightway Systems, Inc. and Ralph Walker, individually and doing business as Brightway.

In another suit filed July 10th, styled Kathleen Burke vs. United Texas Transmission Co., the plaintiff seeks a temporary restraining order to prevent a proposed pipeline crossing by the defendant across 214.822 acres owned by plaintiff, in the International and Great Northern Co. Survey. The plaintiff contends the land is rice land and damage would result to the land by the pipeline crossing and asks for the temporary injunction plus a permanent injunction to keep the defendant from constructing the pipeline across the property.

The long-awaited marker of unveiling of the market then came about when Mr. and Mrs. William H. Harrison, members of the Colorado County Historical Survey Commission, removed the covering and displayed the plaque placed on the wall, next to the entrance to the building.
