Weimar Facing Loss Of Ambulance Service Due To Lack Of Volunteers

[By Ty Holman in The Weimar Mercury]
After nearly six years of service, the Weimar Ambulance Corps is facing a serious problem - manpower.
Normally there are around 30 volunteers, now there are around 20.
To maintain 24 hour ambulance coverage is placing an unusual load on some of the volunteers - for some, 70 to 100 hours on call per week is not unusual. It boils down to this... there are three alternatives:
1. get more help, or
2. curtail service (for instance no service Tuesday and Thursday), or
3. turn the ambulance back to the County.
There is another alternative, but it is out of the question - that of contract ambulance... just too expensive.
Under the present system, the Weimar unit is costing the county taxpayers less than \$500 per month. Compare that to an ambulance contract at \$8,000 to \$12,000 a month. The present fee is \$40 per local call... think what it'd be under contract ambulance.

The next day our cruise brought us to Puerto Vallarta, once sequestered, isolated, out-of-the-way, Indian fishing village, but now a bustling resort city bursting at its seams on the Bay of Banderas in the state of Jalisco.

Gradually, tourists added Vallarta to their itineraries, however it was filming of MGM's "The Night of the Iguala" in 1934 which brought international attention to this area. Richard Burton and Elizabeth Taylor, who starred in the film, were entertained with the place that they purchased a home on a Vallarta hillside.
To become acquainted with Vallarta, you must find Cuale River, the Zoolo, the Malecon, and the Church of Guadalupe. The river, east-west and serves as a natural dividing line within the city itself. Malecon is the waterfront promenade on Banderas Bay. A block east of the Zoolo, the city square, is the Church of Guadalupe, dedicated to the Virgin of Guadalupe. It is topped with a gold-crowned steeple, designed as a replica of the crown worn by the Virgin in Mexico City's Basilica.
Further up the river, loom steep cliffs where luxurious homes cling precariously to the cliff edges. One of the residents has been named "Gringo Gulch" in recognition of Americans who maintain homes in this sector.
