Loessin echoed these sentiments. Prec. 3 Commr. Crockett Leyendecker said he was opposed to enlarging the program noting that once federal funds are stopped, it is hard to end such programs.

The cost to the county would include a share of the cost of utilities and janitorial services. Judge Craneck noted that to date the county's only participation to the senior citizens' \$12,000 budget (a 75-25% participation program between the county and state) has been through "in kind" services such as offering facilities in the county agriculture building, time spent by the judge and other officials, and costs of transportation.

Precinct 2 Commissioner Rafael Veselka said that approval of a meeting place in Columbus might create a problem in that Weimar, Eagle Lake, and possibly other cities might demand similar services.

Judge Craneck said that it apparently was the consensus of opinion of the court that the court not participate in enlarging the program and he indicated he would notify the City of Columbus of such status.

Ambulance Insurance
The court approved advertisements for bids for Ambulance Vehicle Liability and Collision Insurance and also for a Blanket Accident Policy for Volunteers. The present policy expires on Aug. 22nd and the court will consider

bids at the August 13th regular session.

• The court adopted a resolution setting out that \$32,256.96 from the State Lateral Road Refund program would be used for improving lateral roads in the county.

• A pipeline road crossing for Goldking Production Co. under county road 161 (Tenneco plant road) in Precinct 4 was approved.

• Action on approving eleven county road crossings by a pipeline proposed from Katy to Laredo by United Texas Transmission Co. was delayed until August 13th. The county set out that a \$100 inspection fee would be required on each of the 11 crossings and wanted more time to look into the specifications calling for use of cased or uncased pipe under the county road for laying of the 30" gas pipeline.

• Action on telephone burial applications on several county roads was also tabled to August 13th.

Renovation Projects
Judge Craneck said that there were no new developments in the courthouse restoration and the jail renovation programs. He indicated that an additional contractor has shown some interest in bidding on the courthouse restoration; and told the court that the portable building to be added to the jail is to be delivered on Wednesday of this week.

Additional Travel Funds
The court authorized the transfer of \$500 from a fund to provide medical care for indigents to a petty cash funds to take care of travel expenses of private individuals who would be accompanying patients to the San Antonio and Galveston hospitals, instead of use of a sheriff's deputy and a sheriff's vehicle for such transfer.

Judge Craneck told the members of the court that some families have indicated they would like to accompany patients to the hospitals and noted that it would be better to pay the 15¢ per mile travel expenses rather than take a full-time deputy and vehicle out of service for a half day or so.

SB Rate Hike Delayed
The court received certified mail from the Public Utility Commission reporting that a rate increase request from San Bernard Electric Co-op has been delayed for 120 days. The electric company had requested a rate increase effective Aug. 13, 1979.

\$15,000 Damages To Land Asked In Drilling Operation

A suit was filed in District Court at Columbus July 20th by Leo V. Polock seeking \$15,000 in alleged damages to land in the M. D. Ramsey Survey from an oil and gas drilling operation. The defendant in the suit is F. B. Lacy, Inc. of Harris County.

Polock alleges that on Dec. 1, 1978 the defendant drilled a well and damaged land and failed to repair the land as agreed and that the fair market value of the land decreased by \$15,000. The plaintiff asks for that amount in damages plus such other relief to which he is justly entitled.

Suit Asks \$5000 For Personal Injuries In Wreck

A wreck on U.S. 90 two miles east of Columbus June 10, 1978 at 12:01 p.m. resulted in personal injuries to Weldon Marriott alleges the plaintiff Marriott in a suit filed in District Court July 23rd.

He says in the petition that a vehicle he was driving was hit by one driven by Larry Jon Woods and Marriott seeks a total of \$5,000 for personal injuries received in the wreck, plus interest and costs of court from Woods.

"Public Not Allowed"

Clements' new committee met last week and ran into a collision over the open meetings law with a House Education Committee official.

Saying the public was not allowed to attend, Clements' office manager Allen Clark asked Education Committee clerk Rock Fritz to leave a meeting of the governor's advisory committee. Allen said the committee wanted to talk "about personalities, assigning people to committees."

Fritz checked with the Texas Attorney General's office for an opinion on whether the Texas Open Records Act applies to advisory panels and was told the law was not clear.

Bank To Be Blood-Donor Regis. Center

The First National Bank will serve as a blood donor registration center beginning August 1st. The bank will provide Bloodonor Registration Cards for volunteers to pledge to give blood at a location convenient to their home or business during the year.

Bloodonor Programs, Inc. (BDPI), a local non-profit volunteer blood donor registration and scheduling service is sponsoring the 21-countywide registration drive to supplement the efforts of the 10 non-profit area blood banks.

Some 160 banks in the 21-county area will display the Bloodonor Registration Cards to recruit volunteer blood donors between the ages of 17 and 65 with no history of cancer or hepatitis and who weigh at least 110 pounds. Volunteers will be contacted during the next 12 months by BDPI volunteers to schedule a time to give blood. The entire donating process takes about half an hour.

BDPI President Jan Williams says that during last year's registration drive, nearly 16,000 volunteers pledged to save a life by donating blood. Twenty percent of all volunteers were recruited through the registration centers at local banks.

Over 42 Million Grant For Low Income Family Home Weatherization

The State of Texas has been awarded a grant of \$2,722,500 to continue implementation of a Home Weatherization Program for low-income citizens throughout the State. It was announced recently by G. Dan Rambo, Regional Representative of the Secretary, U.S. Department of Energy (DOE).

The grant will allow the State to weatherize an estimated additional 4200 homes of low-income persons under a plan developed by the Texas Department of Community Affairs. This will be the third year that weatherization assistance has been provided to low-income Texans under the DOE Weatherization Program.

The Texas program is part of a nationwide effort to reduce energy consumption and improve the dwelling unit environment of the low-income persons in the Nation.
