

Wm. H. Harrison Honored On Retirement As Bank Officer

Reception At First National For Retiring Board Chairman

Directors, officers and employees of the First National Bank of Eagle Lake honored William H. 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Many Charges Filed In Altair Altercations

The County Sheriff's Department reports that a number of charges were filed last week following altercations which resulted from disturbances at a trailer park on Highway 71 just east of Altair.

The investigation started at 8:30 p.m. Tuesday, July 24th when the sheriff's department was notified of a disturbance at the trailer park. Officers located that one of the tenants who was asked to move began speeding through the area.

Officers said the disturbance reached a point where Leonard Thompson (by his own admission) backed a gravel truck into the trailer belonging to Mildred Gottschald.

Gottschald told officers that she would file charges against Thompson for destroying her trailer. The disturbance flared up again at 12:30 a.m. Wednesday, July 25th and the sheriff's department was called back to the scene.

The officers were told that the trailer park was driving through the area and it appeared that he had a gun in his hand extended out of a van window. Thompson, again by his own admission, shot through the van while it was parked in front of the trailer.

Another call was received at 12:30 a.m. Thursday, July 26th that the disturbance was underway again and this time investigation revealed that Gordon Dana Carpenter, 36, of Corsicana, a resident of the trailer park, was being held by the officers.

The officers were told Carpenter had driven around the trailer park and ended up in Walker's driveway where he was removed from his vehicle and a gun was noted in his pocket. Officers said that the gun was on the ground when they arrived and the 38 revolver was confiscated by the sheriff's department.

Carpenter was charged with public intoxication and brought to the Colorado County Jail. Charges of unlawfully carrying a weapon may be filed upon completion of the investigation, said the sheriff's department report. Meanwhile Carpenter paid a \$110 fine before J. P. Richard Schmidt was released.

Later in the day Thursday, Mildred Gottschald filed complaints against Leonard Thompson and son, Gale Thompson, for destroying the mobile home. She claimed that Leonard and Gale acted together when the gravel truck was backed into her mobile home. The two Thompsons were released on a \$1000 bond each pending grand jury action in the matter.

Disturbances Continued Fri. At 10 p.m. Friday, July 27th the sheriff's office was again notified that there was still another disturbance at the trailer park. This time investigation revealed that Richard Vance Carpenter, 32,

of Corsicana, had gone to his brother's mobile home and started shooting a .22 caliber pistol in the park. Leonard Thompson reportedly got into his pickup truck and gave chase when Carpenter started to leave the park. Thompson reportedly rammed the rear of the Carpenter truck a number of times during the chase and the chase ended at the Skull Creek Lodge in Altair where Carpenter abandoned his truck and ran for the side door of the lodge. Meanwhile officers said that Leonard Thompson attempted to run down Carpenter with his truck and in the process ran his pickup truck through the large double glass doors to the lodge. Thompson was arrested at the scene and charged with destroying property of the lodge.

Richard Vance Carpenter and Gordon Dana Carpenter were also arrested for public intoxication and for further investigation. The carpenters paid a \$200 each before Justice of the Peace Richard Schmidt and were released.

Thompson also posted a \$1000 cash bond on charges of destroying property at the lodge pending grand jury action in the matter. It was estimated that \$3,000 worth of damage resulted from the destruction of the Skull Creek Lodge. An undetermined amount of damage was done to both of the pickup trucks involved.

Sheriff's department adds that further charges may be filed after complete investigation is made.

Officers added that so far, the subjects requested to move from the trailer park have done so, however when the Gottschalds moved they reportedly took a barbecue pit valued at \$800.00 which they claim is theirs and Thompson says is his. 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Rice Truck Driver Injured In Wreck Mon.

A rice truck driver from El Campo was hospitalized Monday with injuries received in the collision of his truck and a 1977 Mack tractor and trailer on Highway 71 a mile east of Nada at 4:15 p.m.

Highway Patrolman Andy Taquard was the investigating officer. His report showed that a 1977 Dodge truck loaded with rice and being driven west on Highway 71 by Albie B. Williams, was traveling at a reduced speed. The Mack truck driven by John Timothy Solanky of Crystal City and owned by Riley Trade Leasing of San Antonio, came up on the rice truck and started to pass but was unable to do so because of approaching traffic and the driver cut back into the ditch and clipped the right rear end of the rice truck. The impact sent the rice truck into a sideways skid and it rolled over several times, spilling the contents of rice into the westbound lane.

It took about three hours for the rice to be gathered up and the lane cleared to traffic.

Williams was taken to the Nightingale Hospital in El Campo by the Garwood Ambulance with back injuries. Garwood volunteer fire department was called to stand a truck to the scene to send in the event of a fire since some fuel was spilled on the roadway.

The truck driven by Solanky continued for a ways into a cotton field owned by Raymond Labay before coming to a stop. The driver was not injured.

The highway patrolman filed charges of failure to control speed against Solanky and for not having a commercial license against Williams.

Chief of Police Buford Ashby investigated the accident near the intersection of Main and Lake. Mrs. Blanco A. Hernandez was driving her vehicle west on Main and Mr. Schiuring was riding on the back of the truck when it hit the side of the approaching station wagon.
