Zimmerscheidt-Leyendecker House Meeting Place For Historical Society

The Zimmerscheidt-Leyendecker House, known as the Brune House, was the meeting place for members and guests of the Colorado County Historical Society Commission on July 26.

A covered dish supper was served on the long front porch and guests were invited to browse around and study the unique features of the old home, last occupied by Dr. and Mrs. Emil Brune.

Following a short business meeting by Mrs. Mary Elizabeth Hopkins, her daughter Mary Ann Perkins narrated slides shown by James Hopkins.

She gave a brief history of her grandfather.

The Zimmerscheidt family was among the first five Germans to come to Texas. They arrived by 1832, leaving daughter Josephine in Germany to finish school.

She married Johann Leyendecker and they came to Texas in 1843, bringing four children, one of whom was Johann Frederick (Fritz) Leyendecker, about 1845.

As a young man, Fritz made good grades at Baylor and was appointed overseer of roads in Colorado County. He was a private in the Civil War.

He had a long political career following his parole, holding such positions as justice of the peace, notary public, county commissioner, supervisor of elections, trustee of the Leyendecker Neighborhood School, member of the Colorado County police court.

He served in the Texas Legislature, closing out his career by serving as chairman of the county Democratic convention in 1902.

His life time interest was horticulture. The magnolias surrounding the courthouse came from his field.

Fritz was known and respected throughout the Southwest for his activities, winning many awards. Fritz left his home to his

Other Cities Also Having Police Problems

The Chief of Police, two patrolmen and the police department's recording secretary all resigned Monday afternoon, July 30 at a special meeting of the Hallettsville City Council, leaving Hallettsville with only one policeman.

Chief Charles R. Holley, patrolmen Scott Simpson and Jim Jakubek and recording secretary Ms. Kay Pinner submitted resignations, all dated July 24.

Hallettsville Mayor Franklin Billimek said this was the third time such an incident had come up, however, the other incidents included other city personnel.

Mayor Billimek stated the City Council is duly elected to chart the course of city business. He said the City Hall had a total of five employees and the Police Department alone had five employees.

The Mayor said the Council's decision to move Ms. Pinner to the City Hall to assist where help is necessary brought about the decision of the Police Department personnel to resign. Up until recently the Police Department's office was the County Jail. Ms. Pinner would have received a raise in salary and would have had the help of other women working in the City Hall Mayor stated.

Mayor Billimek added that the City Council cannot continue to condone such cases of insubordination.

Police Patrolman Elmo Grant chose to remain on the City Police Force.

The Colorado County Citizens reported last week that Bobby Friedrich has resigned from the Columbus Police Department, effective Aug. 1, said Police Chief Ed Potter.

Friedrich said he wanted to devote more time to his metal art business.

Potter said James Brooks, former sheriff's deputy, had been named to succeed Friedrich. His appointment was set Aug. 1.

On Strengthening A Marriage

A strong middle-years marriage can provide a shelter against loneliness, the ease of life-long friendship and many memories.

But many marriages hit a low point in the middle years. Strengthening a marriage to prepare for the middle years is one answer—as opposed to divorce, separation or an unsatisfying relationship when the middle years arrive.

Why A Low Point? Researchers say middle-years marriages reach a low point because of several factors.

These factors include excessive domination by the husband, failure to communicate, poor self-esteem, decreasing companionship and failure to express affection and appreciation.

Other factors include heavy involvement with careers, extramarital involvements and mid-life change.

How To Strengthen To strengthen a marriage that will survive the child-rearing years, the "empty nest" and the mid-life role upheaval, here are some guidelines:

1) Establish your marriage relationship at the top of your priority list early in the marriage.

2) Do not allow the demands and activities of parenthood to crowd out husband-wife interaction. Plan special time with your spouse.

3) Strive toward equality in all aspects of your relationship.

4) Work at creating interesting friendships, especially with other couples who have satisfying marriages.

5) Evaluate your marriage
