TV, Movies Contribute To Crime Rate

Almost two out of every three Texans think that crime and violence on television and in the movies cause moderate to large increases in the crime rate. This was one of the findings of the latest Texas Crime Poll, a survey of attitudes and opinions in the area of Criminal Justice conducted by the Criminal Justice Center at Sam Houston State University.

A total of 1,463 Texans living in 176 counties participated in the survey. They were asked separate questions concerning television and the movies, and results were almost identical.

A total of 28% felt that crime and violence on television have caused a "large increase" in crime and 57% said a "moderate increase." Of the remainder, 23% felt they caused "very little increase" and 13% said they had "no effect."

One fourth (25%) of those participating felt that crime and violence in the movies caused a "large increase" in crime and 35% said a "moderate increase." Another 26% felt they caused "very little increase" and 12% again said they had "no effect."

Dr. Glen Kercher, an associate professor of criminal justice at Sam Houston State University, said that most studies have shown that viewed violence can cause violent behavior, but that there are exceptions.

Survey Responses
Survey participants were asked what improved criminal justice services they would support with increased taxes. Improved police services, followed by court system, 52% more prison facilities, 22% probation services, 12%, and more judges, 11%. Some 34% said they would not approve of a tax increase for any of the improvements.

Another section of the survey contained questions designed to measure the public's fear of crime and what Texans are doing to protect themselves. Several of the questions had been asked on previous surveys and were asked again for comparison purposes, and two were new.

About the same number of participants (57%) felt they would be the victim of at least one crime within the next year. More than half (54%) said they were afraid to walk alone at night within a mile of their home and one-fourth (26%) said they would be afraid to walk within a block of their home. The results of two previous surveys were similar.

A new question concerned fear of being alone in the home at night. Some 40% said they were afraid "sometimes," 3% said "most of the time" and another 5% said "always." Over three-fourths (79%) of the respondents said they had placed at least one security device in their home, such as guns (38%), door bolts (35%), extra locks (30%), outside lights (30%) and guard dogs (17%).

Zeno Smith Subject of S.A. Express Story

George Carmack, writer for the San Antonio Express published an article in the Express-News of Sat., April 28th about famous Texas Rangers, among whom was Zeno Smith. "No one ever saw Texas Ranger Zeno Smith and forgot him," particularly a guilty man Zeno was seeking for a crime," said Carmack. A quarter page picture of Smith, a former Eagle Lake resident for many years, appeared with the story and the caption read, "This photograph makes plain Zeno's fearlessness and his rock-like determination." . . . Smith, referred to in the story as the "Good Guy who wears a black hat," is the Ranger best known in San Antonio area, on duty there for 25 of his 34 years of Ranger Service.
