Free and Reduced Price Meal Lunch Policy

The Rice Consolidated Independent School District has announced its policy for Free and Reduced Price Meals for children unable to pay the full price of meals served under the National School Lunch Program.

Local school officials have adopted the following family size income criteria for determining eligibility:

We certify to the Texas Education Agency that the above named school district's Free and Reduced Price Meal and Free Milk Policy Statement, which was approved for the 1976-77 school year, has been amended to include the below-listed eligibility income scale in lieu of the previously adopted scale. We agree to use the income scale indicated below as a criterion for determining the eligibility of students for free meals and reduced-price meals and free "extra" milk for schools participating in the Special Milk Program beginning with the 1979-80 school year and thereafter or until subsequently amended.

Each school district may determine the price charged for reduced-price meals, but in no case may the charge for a reduced-price lunch exceed 10¢ or a reduced-price breakfast exceed 10¢.

Children from families whose income is at or below the levels shown are eligible for free or reduced price meals. In addition, families not meeting these criteria but with other unusual expenses due to unusually high medical expenses, shelter costs in excess of 30% of income, special education expenses due to the mental or physical condition of a child, disaster or casualty losses or who become unemployed, provided that the loss of income causes the family income during the period of unemployment to be at or below the levels shown on the scale, are urged to apply.

Application forms are being sent to all homes in a letter to parents. Additional copies are available at the principal's office in each school. The information provided on the application is confidential and will be used only for the purpose of determining eligibility. Applications may be submitted at any time during the year.

In certain cases foster children are also eligible for these benefits. If a family has foster children living with them and wishes to apply for such meals for them, it should contact the school.

In the operation of child feeding programs, no child will be discriminated against because of race, sex, color or national origin.

Under the provisions of the policy, the Building Principal will review applications and determine eligibility. If a parent is dissatisfied with the ruling of the official, he may make a request, either orally or in writing to the Superintendent of Schools, Drawer 338, Altus, Texas 77412, A/C 713 234-3531 for a hearing to appeal the decision. The policy contains an outline of the hearing procedure.

Each school and the office of the superintendent has a copy of the complete policy which may be reviewed by any interested party.
