**GPA Changes For 1979-80**

When a student graduates high school and goes to college or gets a job, the college or employer will require a high school transcript from this individual. This high school transcript will show the quarter grade for each subject the individual has taken while in high school.

One of the things that will be looked for will be the individual's class rank. Class rank means how this student compared to the other students in his class. If a student ranked 33rd in a class of 100 students, this would mean that this individual had a better average grade or grade point than 67 of the students in his class.

Grade point averages are used to compute class rank at Rice High School. Students are given the opportunity to earn a bonus grade point by taking a premium level course. If a student takes all regular courses, the maximum grade point average for that student would be a 3.0 G.P.A.
