Gas and Tax Adjustment clause in the rural residential and small commercial rates. All other rates presently include a Purchase Gas Adjustment clause and a Tax Adjustment clause is being added.

A rural residential customer's average monthly bill will increase from \$2.94 per month without a Purchase Gas Adjustment to \$2.25 per month under the increased rates, including a Purchase Gas Adjustment based on the average cost per Mcf of purchased gas for July, 1979.

The city rate will increase by 26.5¢ per Mcf or 13.3%, exclusive of the cost of purchased gas.

The typical small rural industrial customer's monthly bill will increase 27.5¢ per Mcf or 13.8%, exclusive of the cost of purchased gas.

Colorado County Sheriff's Department, in its investigation of the recent burglary of the Borden Country Club, has recovered a Doberman Pinscher dog which was listed among the items stolen.
