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News From Wintermann Library (By June Purdie, Librarian)

Ernest Lehmann is a noted screenwriter, producer, and director. His screenplays include North by Northwest, West Side Story, Somebody Up There Likes Me, The Sound of Music, The King and I, and Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf? His latest book is The French Atlantic Affair about a passenger liner. Here is a brief summary of that book:

The whole world believes she is on her regular course from New York to Le Havre with 3000 passengers aboard. And then the shocking truth is revealed to a selected few on land and at sea: the S.S. Marcelline, 65,000-ton pride of the French Atlantic Line, has been secretly taken over in mid-ocean by 174 shadowy conspirators and diverted toward a rendezvous in the southern Atlantic. Unless a ransom of \$35,000,000 in gold is paid within forty-eight hours, the ship and all her passengers will be blown up.

Battling the clock are a diverse group of men and women in Paris, New York, Washington, southern California and out on the Atlantic Ocean, all of them having only one thing in common: a passionate desire to avert the impending catastrophe.

Among them are a celebrated American novelist of dubious morality; a doctor of geriatric medicine with obsessive interest in amateur

eroticism; a producer, and emotionally exhausted captain of the ship; the director general of the French Atlantic Line in Paris; the president of France and the United States; a ravishing young female reporter on the International Herald Tribune in Paris; the head of the French Surete Nationale; a television writer-producer in Beverly Hills and his spunky wife; a senior vice president of CBS-News in New York; a think-tank group at the Rand Corporation in Malibu; and a giant computer named 307.

Written with a prodigious flair for sophisticated intrigue, incisive characterization and heart-stopping action, The French Atlantic Affair is grand and gripping entertainment.
