

ELMS Eighth Grade Downs Weimar 22 to 0

7th and 8th Grade Games In Sealy Thurs. at 5:30 & 7:00

The Eagle Lake Middle School eighth grade Raiders won their season opener with a 22 to 0 victory over Weimar last Thursday night in Eagle Lake.

The seventh graders held a scrimmage with Weimar prior to the eighth grade game and although there was no scoring, the Raiders picked up 147 yards while allowing Weimar only 20 yards.

This Thursday both Raider teams will be in action as they travel to Sealy with the seventh grade game kicking off at 5:30 and the eighth graders following at 7:00 p.m.

Raiders coaches Dale Norris and Ric Weaver expressed their pleasure with the performances of both Raider

squads. "We were proud of the way both teams performed," said the coaches, adding, "we moved the ball real well on offense and had a terrific defensive effort."

Several individual performances were cited by the coaches in the seventh grade contest including quarterback George Castillo and running backs Malcolm Thomas and Keith Pennell. On defense Johnny Darnell made several good one on one tackles with Rodney Witte and Steve Sims also turned in good plays.

Raiders 22 Weimar 0. In the 22 to 0 victory by the eighth grade Raiders, running back Michael Davis scored two touchdowns and end Tony Long caught a 26 yard pass for the other. Gilbert Ruiz scored one of the extra point conversions for the Raiders, with Delbert Jarvis catching a pass for the

conversion after the final touchdown by Long in the fourth quarter. Both TD's by Davis came in the first half as the Raiders led 14 to 0. Other standouts on offense were quarterback John Doe and running back Terry Cunningham with good play turned in on defense by back James Amos, lineman Rupert Contreras and line backer Jeff Argo who intercepted a pass to set up the Raiders' fourth quarter score, and also Long who played at linebacker.

Quail Bag Limit In This Area Upped To 16 Per Day

The Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission at a public meeting in Austin Wednesday (Sept. 28) increased per day bag limits on quail for the upcoming hunting season.

In response to biological surveys which showed unusually high quail populations, the commission set limits of 20 per day and 60 in possession for counties under the department's regulatory authority in South Texas and the Trans-Pecos.

These are the highest quail bag and possession limits allowed in Texas since the department first was given authority to set the limits beginning in the early 1950's, according to Don Wilson, quail species leader for the department.

Other regions also were given increased limits, with a 15 per day and 45 in possession limit established for much of the western half of the state and in 16 Southeast Texas counties, including Colorado, Austin, Lavaca, Wharton and Fort Bend counties.

The smallest limits were assigned in East Texas and in roughly the western half of the Panhandle, at 12 per day and 36 in possession.

Wilson told the commission that outstanding quail production during the year warranted the increased bag limits to allow additional recreation from quail which would otherwise be lost to natural causes. Extensive research through the years has shown that quail populations are extremely cyclic and annual mortality is commonly as high as 80 percent in some years whether the population is hunted or not.

Raiders Open Dist. 20AA Play In Sealy 7:30 Friday

Raiders Regrouping After Four Regulars Drop From Varsity

Despite the fact that the Rice High School Raider varsity team lost four team members, including two starters on both offense and defense, who chose to discontinue football last week, Coach Mike Rice reports that the "altitude" was never better and determination never greater in anticipation of the Raiders' District 20AA opener in Sealy at 7:30 p.m. Friday night.

Raiders fans are reminded that District 20AA games begin at 7:30 p.m. instead of the 8:00 p.m. kickoff time for the past three non-conference tilts.

The Raiders draw their first district foe, the State Class AA defending champion Sealy Tigers, and according to Coach Rice, "they have a lot of talent left from that fine team in 1978."

The Raiders enter the game with a one-win-two-loss record in non-district play, while Sealy, ranked No. 1 in the Houston area but unranked in the AP poll, is 9-0.

The Tigers have a lot of talent in running backs Cobb and Fogle, and quarterback Bobby Brown. Of course, they are missing high school All-American Eric Dickerson and all-district back Scott Alai and others.

They have a fine wide receiver in Ricky Cloud and get good line play from Martin Frank and boast a strong defensive secondary, mostly returning veterans.

Choosing to drop from the team rather than meet practice requirements expected by Rice and his staff were junior Victor Davis, who has been the starting quarterback and a starting defensive back; junior Earnest Fields, starting offensive and defensive end; junior Ricky Fry, offensive and defensive back; and sophomore Kenneth Bluntson, defensive tackle. Earlier senior guard Melvin Carter was dropped from the team.

Hyak To Be QB. Coach Rice and staff have moved 165 pound junior Kenny Hyak to the starting quarterback position and noted that he has been doing a good job. Joining him as starters in the offensive backfield against Sealy will be 170 pound junior John Schneider at tailback, 150 pound junior Robert Barrios at wide receiver, and 165 pound senior Jeff Darden, the fourth back. The starting offensive line will include 175 pound senior John Chisholm (who is recuperating from an injury) or 215 pound sophomore Michael Faehlinger at center, 225 pound junior Johnny Gonzales and 190 pound senior Andy Morales at guards, 250 pound sophomore James Rhodes and 220 pound junior Mike Ross at tackle and 190 pound junior Robert Frazier at tight end.

Barrios has been nursing a hurt shoulder but is expected to play. He also does a fine job in running back punts and kickoffs.

On defense, the Raiders will line up like this, Gonzales at nose guard, Rhodes and Morales at tackles, Darden

at guard, and 190 pound junior Robert Frazier at tight end.

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and Barrios at ends, Schneider and 190 pound senior Lester Pettus at linebackers. Hyak, 150 pound senior Randy Epps, 160 pound senior Robby Cook and either Kenneth Hemphill or John Dawson (both sophomores who were pulled up from the JV unit this week) as defensive backs.

Thus it can be noted that seven of the defensive

starters are also offensive starters and will be going both ways most of the game.

Also pulled up from the JV unit to bolster the Raider backfield was junior Karl Hurd.

The Raiders expect to "give it their best effort" against Sealy in hopes of opening District 20AA play with a big victory, commented Coach Rice.
